

Pro Bono Partnership of Atlanta names Richard C. Litwin as a “2019 PBPA Volunteer of the Year.”

On March 11, 2020, PBPA held its annual reception at King & Spalding. At the reception, Mr. Litwin was one of six attorneys receiving plaudits for outstanding volunteer pro bono efforts.

PBPA matches attorneys (based on their particular expertise) with Metro Atlanta nonprofits in need of free legal counsel. Through PBPA, Mr. Litwin help nonprofits facing state and local tax issues.

As a PBPA volunteer, Mr. Litwin has helped nonprofit organizations with specific state/local tax cases/matters. Mr. Litwin’s has also offered his expertise in other work with PBPA. At PBPA-sponsored seminars and Webcasts, Mr. Litwin has spoken on state and local tax issues affecting nonprofit organizations. Also, Mr. Litwin is a member of a PBPA task force that is working with the Georgia Department of Revenue to provide substantive written guidance on sales and use tax obligations tied to fundraising activities, such as galas, tournaments, races and silent auctions.

Mr. Litwin deals with a variety of issues that arise during audit and during protest and appeal to the Georgia Tax Tribunal and to local governments. For over 30 years, and as a recognized Super Lawyer since 2008, Mr. Litwin has devoted his practice to multistate tax, state and local tax, and tax controversies. He has chaired the Atlanta Bar Association Tax Law Section and State Bar of Georgia’s Taxation Law Section and co-moderates the Georgia Department of Revenue/Tax Bar Liaison Committee.
